Meet Dulcea

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of her rescue she was blind from an untreated eye infection. She was in extreme pain and both eyes had to be removed.

Meet Crawford

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he suffered from hook and tape worms, infected eyes and ears, and tooth and gum disease.

Meet Telly

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he had been suffering from an untreated slipped disc.

He lay in his crate paralyzed for 6 months in the USDA kennel. After his rescue, he had surgery to try and fix it but it was too late. He is permanently paralyzed and suffers from constant bladder infections because he can not urinate on his own. He also had tooth and gum disease.

Meet Dolly

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. Dolly had the following health conditions at the time of her rescue.

*Hearworm and heart disease

*Hookworm

*Conjunctivitis and Dry Eye Syndrome

*Ehrlichia--A serious tick-borne bacteria transmittable to humans and monitored by the Center for Disease Control



Meet Pearl

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. Pearl had the following health conditions at the time of her rescue.

* Two very large inguinal hernias which contained part of her intestines and uterus and required multiple surgeries, as well as a perineal hernia.

*Pyometra--a serious infection of the uterus requiring surgery.

*Congestive heart failure

*Congenital deformity of the front leg

*No teeth



Meet Abbey

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. Abbey had the following health conditions at the time of her rescue.

- *Chronic liver failure
- *Ear mites and hookworm
- *Severe dental decay
- *Multiple mammary tumors requiring radical mastectomies of all breasts.
- *Missing left foot
- *Campylobacter--A bacteria transmittable to humans and monitored by the Center for Disease Control



Meet Emory

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he suffered from severe untreated eye infections.

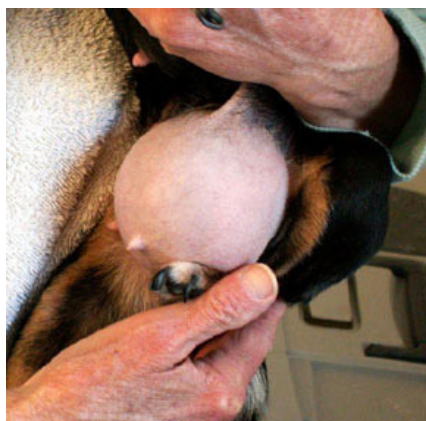


Meet Emmylou

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. The kennel had large animal vet do a c-section and remove mammary tumors. She died of cancer soon after rescue.

Her breeder was voted Breeder of the Year in Missouri.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel.

At the time of her rescue she had a huge inguinal hernia.

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he had mange and a lame rear leg.

Meet Jennilyn

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of her rescue she was diagnosed with patent ductus arteriosus-- an arterial connection between the aorta and the pulmonary artery that normally closes at birth or shortly after. She required heart surgery

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of her rescue she had no teeth, tumors and an infection.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She died soon after her rescue of heart failure caused by years of untreated rotten teeth and infection.

Meet Bart

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he had a broken jaw from being kicked and was also blind and deaf from blunt force head trauma to the head.

Meet Albert

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he had sarcoptic mange, an ulcerated eye, ear infection and tooth and gum disease.

Meet Zachary

He came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of his rescue he had no teeth and was missing his lower jaw due to years of untreated dental infection.

He required spinal surgery and extensive physical therapy to correct his paralysis.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She was severely malnourished and almost died.

She had breast cancer and required a radical mastectomy. She had an enlarged heart as well as severe dental infection requiring 11 teeth to be removed.

He had severe dental infection and was missing his lower jaw making it very difficult for him to eat. He also had chronic liver failure, intestinal parasites and ear mites.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She was diagnosed severe dental infection, numerous mammary tumors and was very afraid of people.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She was diagnosed with advanced cancer and had to be euthanized.



Meet Wendy

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She was diagnosed with a congenital deformity of her mouth and nose.



Meet Chava

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of her rescue she was severely matted, eye recently gouged out and never treated, deformed legs, severe dental infection requiring all teeth to be pulled, toe nails so long they dug into the pads of her feet, ear mites and intestinal parasites. She was terrified of people.

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. She was diagnosed with severe dental decay and numerous mammary tumors. Very afraid of people.



Meet Lizzie

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel. At the time of her rescue she had infected bite wounds on her head and nose, and an open puncture wound on her neck that required stitches.

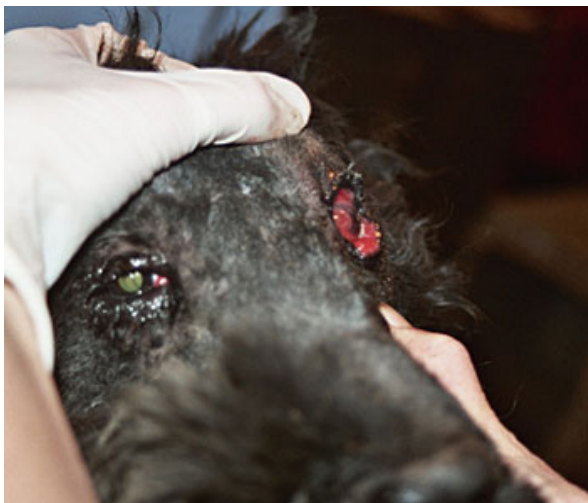


Meet Duffy

Meet Miracle

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel.

After her rescue a vet attempted to spay her and found dead puppies inside. They had been there so long that they formed into hard masses. While attempting to get the puppies out, her uterus ruptured. She never left the hospital and died 10 days later.

Meet Sweetie

She came from a USDA licensed and inspected commercial kennel.

Five days before her rescue this 10 year old yorkie attempted to delivery “water babies” (puppies with severe swelling). The puppies were too large for her to deliver so the breeder pulled them out instead of having a C-section done.

She had a severe uterine infection and mastitis and barely survived.

She died 4 months later of congestive heart failure.
